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I have had 1942, we offer it at the aforementioned Border Grill. A few shorts on DJ 1942...This tequila is actually aged anywhere from 2 to 3 years. The people at Don Julio do not age the DJ 1942 or the DJ Real for any set amount of time. They use a panel of tasting experts to decide when their Extra Anejos are ready for bottling. If you enjoy DJ 1942, you might want to try Real. It is aged in the neighborhood of 5 years, with the expert paneling, deciding when it is ready. They are both very fine tequilas in the Extra Anejo category...However, for the price point, I actually like Casa Noble Anejo better at around \$99 a bottle. Also, look into El Tesoro Paridiso for \$110ish along with The El Tesoro 70th Anniversary for \$125ish. I believe both exceed 1942 as an extra anejo for the price point. Enjoy
